Direct Ask:

Letters, calls, one-on-one meetings

• Events:

 Car washes, tournaments, community nights

• Sponsorships:

Tiered packages or a la carte benefits

• Grants:

 Local foundations and education-focused funds

- Host an open house or demo night
- Sell custom team merch
- Local business give-back nights (Chipotle, local pizza)
- Offer tech/STEM tutoring for kids
- Summer Camps
- Host an event
- Create a "sponsor-a-part" campaign (motors, tools, travel)

Event Fundraising Strategies



- Offer VIP seating or hospitality for donors
- Award presentation/speaking opportunities
- Corporate Volunteer Days to staff event
- Display a donor wall at your event
- Invite local press or elected officials
- Partner with food trucks or vendors for revenue share
 - Fine Design (for larger events)





Best Practices & Things to Keep in Mind

- **Start Early:** Fundraising takes time- plan ahead.
- **Tell Your Story:** People give to people, not just causes.
- **Tailor your pitch:** Know what you can offer in return.
- Be Clear About Needs: Be specific- "Help us buy motors" is better than "Support our team."
- Show Gratitude: Thank your donors early and often.
- **Stay Organized:** Use spreadsheets or software to track asks and follow-ups.
- Leverage Your Network: Don't go it alone
 – tap into
 parents, mentors, and alumni.
- Think Long-Term: Aim to build relationships, not just raise dollars
